

Viburnum acerifolium

Mapleleaf Viburnum

Height: 3' to 6'

Spread: 2' to 4'

Sun: Full sun to part shade

Soil Moisture: Mesic to Dry

Soil Types: Prefers moist loam but tolerates other soils

Bloom Time: Mid to late spring

Bloom Description: Showy white cymes

Fruit: Blue-black fruit in late summer

Leaves: Excellent fall color includes pink, magenta, red or orange

Uses: Hedge, shrub borders, woodlands, naturalistic and informal settings, bird habitat

Wildlife: Berries eaten by many woodland songbirds

Nectar and pollen: bees, flies, wasps, butterflies and skipper

Larval Host: Spring/Summer Azure and several moths

Comments: Will sucker into colonies if not pruned. Do not prune for form.
